1/19 Pre Course

This Pre Course is a compulsory weekend for all cadets wishing to be considered to attend JNCO, SNCO, CWOFF or CUO Courses in July or September 2019. All cadets wishing to attend must nominate on CEA. Cadets who are attending their second or subsequent Pre Course at this level (e.g. second JNCO Pre Course) may elect to attend on Sunday only to complete assessments. Saturday is compulsory for cadets on their first Pre Course.

Location: Timor Barracks, corner Kissing Point Rd & Stewart St, Dundas

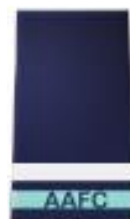
Dress: Saturday – DPU with baseball cap

Bring: **Completed Consent Form**

Attending this course does not guarantee you a position on a 3WG Promotion Course. A recommendation from staff to attend is always subject to availability of positions. Candidates MUST be eligible, willing and available to attend the 2/19 Promotion Courses from 06-20 Jul 19. CWOFF and CUO candidates must hold a First Aid Certificate. Cadets aged 18+ or about to turn 18 must have completed the Adult Transition Package (ATP). ALL cadets must have completed the Defence Youth Safety Level 6 Training Package (DYSL6)
